Shop builds sailing dory for Tim Horton's Camp

It was overcast and blowing half a gale when staff of The Dory Shop of Lunenburg arrived at Tatamagouche for the launch of the Tim Horton Children's Camp's new sailing dory June 16.

But that didn't dissuade camp counselors from taking their new boat out on the

bay. Dory builders Jay Langford and Gary Dares accompanied the group as part of a full orientation provided to camp staff.

One of the first lessons? How to reduce sail when faced with too much wind! It was a bit of a rough ride, and certainly a wet one, for the boat that builders' affectionately nicknamed Timbit after the donut hole treats that are sold at the restaurants that sponsor this and five other camp facilities. But the young staff was keen, and returned to shore grinning ear to ear.

"What we want to provide our campers is a very authentic experience of Nova Scotia and Maritime Canada, and we felt that a dory would be a great addition," said Ryan Underhill, program manager at Tatamagouche.

The dory, which measure just over 22' in length with more than 6' of beam, is also outfitted with a small outboard motor and four rowing stations so that she can be used as a pulling boat on days when winds are light.

In Spring of 2012, YSI will be launching another Cabot 3 for a client in Long Island, New York. This will be the first Cabot fitted with a pilot house - making an attractive addition for cold weather sailors.

A Banks dory built by The Dory Shop in Lunenburg once again earned a prize at the 20th annual WoodenBoat Show held in Mystic, CT June 24 - 26.

The sweet little rowing dory, measuring just 14'8" overall, was awarded honourable mention in the Professionally-built, Manually-powered category of the show's Concours d'Elegance.

This was the second year in a row that one of the shop's dories won a prize at the show.

Last year, their 17' rowing dory was recognized in the same category.

After the show, the boat, known as Black Rocks dory, was delivered to her new owner in Marblehead, Massachusetts.

The Dory Shop also exhibited a 19'8" wooden semidory skiff built for the Barque *Picton Castle*.

Tern Boatworks submarine playground

Tern Boatworks in Chester Basin is building a wooden submarine which will be used as a playground for children on the Halifax waterfront. The submarine is slated to replace the old

playground that has been enjoyed by families visiting the waterfront for over 25 years. The submarine was commissioned by the Waterfront Development Corporation Ltd.

The laminated backbone timbers and the strip planked hull of the submarine are constructed with Western red cedar, and sheathed in fibreglass cloth set in epoxy. The deck is covered with plywood and will also be fibreglassed. The sub contains fibreglass play components and a conning tower.

The team at Tern Boatworks is currently fairing the hull, the deck has been glassed over and they are working on construction of the fin and conning tower. The playground is expected to be installed on the waterfront at the end of September. For more information and photos on the submarine check out the Tern Boatworks website.
